This month's <u>Growth Plan Summit in Kotor</u> brought together Western Balkans leaders and EU representatives to discuss the EU's Growth Plan.

Montenegro's Prime Minister, Milojko Spajić, and European Commissioner

Olivér Várhelyi highlighted commitments to further integration with the EU's single market, focusing on participation with the EU's critical medicines

alliance, the EU digital identity wallet, and agreements on conformity assessment. The summit also addressed progress made in integrating the region into SEPA, boosting digital connections through the WiFi4WB and European Digital Innovation Hubs, and establishing "Green Lanes" to reduce costs, reinforcing that regional collaboration is key to EU integration.

At the same time, the European Commission continues to support Western Balkan governments individually. This time, North Macedonia received €50 million as Macro-Financial Assistance (MFA). This financial support aims to address economic challenges from the energy crisis, stabilise the economy, and support essential reforms. It aligns with North Macedonia's European integration ambitions and follows key policy commitments, including fiscal reforms and enhanced public investment management.


